

## SULA'S TODDLER ROBE

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<p><b>SLEEVES:</b> CUT 2 11" x 14"</p> <p>9" FOLD</p> <p>10"</p> <p>CUT 7"</p> <p>4"</p> <p>7" CUT</p> <p>30"</p> <p>20"</p> <p>16"</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Cut a neck curve of approx. 3" from edge (shown in gray, but make a nice non-pixelated curve, about 2" deep)</li> <li>2. Stitch 10" sides together to form hood.</li> <li>3. Stitch 20" sides together to form back seam.</li> <li>4. Stitch 11" sides of sleeves together to form a tube.</li> <li>5. Sew sleeves into 7" cut s</li> <li>6. Open center back seam (step 3) and align center back seam with hood back seam (step 2). You will open that 4" slit in the process.</li> <li>7. While pinning, take a 2" tuck in the hood at the center back.</li> <li>8. Stitch across shoulder seam.</li> <li>9. Finish raw edges with double-turned hem (1" allowed in pattern).</li> </ol>
<p><b>NOTES:</b> 1" seam allowances, for French seaming. It is a bit on the short side, designed for little legs that need to run as well as to fit on a single piece of 60" fabric. You'll only need to buy 2/3 yd. that way (unless your fabric is directional like mine)</p>
